On the first evening of the 2011 Gathering, an Earth, Wind, Fire, and Water Ceremony was held outdoors. The song "The Earth is Our Mother" played as the Grandmothers were seated in a circle around a fire pit and were called to service to help heal Mother Earth. The Grandmothers were reminded of the many changes to Mother Earth since our last Gathering.....tornadoes, floods, earthquakes, tsunamis, volcanic eruptions, and an oil spill in the Gulf. As a result of the Gulf spill, a group of our sisters in the West (San Diego), the Women of Ancient Wisdom, created prayer flags and prayer sticks that were infused with their prayers and good (cont'd page 9)

intentions for healing Mother Earth and the Gulf. These were handed out to the Grandmothers as they entered the circle. Each member of the circle came forward, voiced her own intention, and placed the flags and sticks in the sacred fire. The transformative power of the sacred fire was asked to release into the Universe the prayers and intentions, to be lifted up as smoke, carried by the winds to the Creator. As the fire consumed the prayer sticks, we continued with an ancient Turtle Story. The ashes from the prayer sticks were carefully collected and will be given to the Gulf of Mexico in another small ceremony in May.

After that, Grandmothers came forward with offerings of earth and water brought from homes and around the world. The water came from glacier melts, rivers, creeks, ponds, and springs including the Gulf of Mexico, the Great Lakes, Caribbean Sea, Turkey, Alabama, Florida, Louisiana, Texas, and Mexico. The earth came from gardens, beaches, farms, and yards in Florida, Illinois, Louisiana, Mississippi, Normandy (France), Sherwood Forest (England) and included frankincense and myrrh resins. Each Grandmother left with a packet of soil and a small vial of water to use in blessing their homes upon their return. When the Grandmothers speak the Earth will heal.

"You have been telling the people that this is the Eleventh Hour. Now you must go back and tell the people that this is The Hour. Here are the things that must be considered: Where are you living? What are you doing? What are your relationships? Are you in right relation? Where is your water? Know our garden. It is time to speak your Truth. Create your community. Be good to each other. And do not look outside yourself for the leader. This could be a good time! There is a river flowing now very fast. It is so great and swift, that there are those who will be afraid. They will try to hold on to the shore. The will feel they are being torn apart and will suffer greatly, know the river has its destination The elders say we must let go of the shore, push off into the middle of the river keep our eyes open, and our heads above the water And I say, see who is in there with you and celebrate this time in history, we are to take nothing personal. Least of all ourselves. For the moment that we do, our spiritual growth and journey comes to a halt. The time of the lone wolf is over. Gather ourselves! Banish the word "struggle" from your attitude and your vocabulary. All that we do now must be done in a sacred manner and in celebration. We are the ones we have been waiting for!"

The Wisdom of the Grandmothers

The International Council of Thirteen Indigenous Grandmothers offered a six-week telephone course on The Wisdom of the Grandmothers beginning in February, organized through the Shift Network (the shiftnetwork.com). About 700 people from 17 countries joined the conversation, including two Grandmothers from our councils, Robbie Lapp and Joanne Reichlin. These are their reports.

One session focused on ancestors. Grandmother Beatrice Long Visitor Holy Dance shared, "Our people know that the land and the language are one. If we lose one or the other, we are no longer who we say we are." She spoke of greeting the day at morning sun with a drink of water and thanks, just as the bird does by swallowing and raising her head to the sky in gratitude.

Grandmother Margaret Behan, who was at the Grandmothers Gathering for Gitchigaaming, asks us to pick up a rock and pray as knowledge comes through that way. May we use power in such a way to harmonize the earth.

The moderator then requested that three of us listening press #1 on our phones to offer a closing. A beautiful prayer is offered, the grandmothers' song comes to my heart and mind, and I press #1 and hear the moderator say, "Roberto" in Spanish. Singing starts from me anyway and I hear the song on my computer. Part of my gulps and my lungs and larynx keep on singing,

"Grandmothers, Grandmothers in the ancient stones, Grandmothers, Grandmothers carried in our bones, Grandmothers, Grandmothers ancient, wise and true, Grandmothers, Grandmothers, we honor you."

When it is done, I remember and thank Grandmother Terry Bourne, through whom the song came.

More surprise of spirit and synchronicity came when Grandmother Joanne Reichlin e-mailed and shared that she heard the call and our song. She shared copies of the notes she took of all six sessions. Profound reflections and conceptions ripple on.
